Executive **Summary**

Thank you for taking the time to read our impact brief. It's taken us a long time to get around to writing it! We've been delivering workshops within the educational sphere for almost **13 years**. We've had the pleasure of working with **half a million** students within over 650 educational establishments. From day one, we have been committed to internally assess every interaction we've had with students, and still today, we remain overwhelmed by the fantastic feedback we receive both on the quality of our trainers and our content. Analysing this data and feedback has allowed us to regularly reflect on our work and make the adjustments and additions to widen our scope, increase our impact and maintain our relevance. Over the last five years, we've been pleased to support some large-scale projects sponsored by the Office for Students (OfS). This has meant that we've had the opportunity for our work to be scrutinised and examined by independent bodies. This independent analysis and verification of our impact came to us as a welcome validation for not only what we believe in, but also the work we do and how we deliver it. Education is in a tough spot right now, with budgets being squeezed and goalposts being moved. But the thinking skills that we share with students remain just as important (if not more so) as they've ever been. We trust that our political leaders continue to encourage independent thinking to flourish within schools, colleges and universities.





Key findings of this impact brief:

- Students who take part in our workshops have an HE application rate **22% points higher** than students who do not take part; **a statistically** significant difference.
- **2** Those who take part in our workshops also have **an HE acceptance rate 9% points higher** than students who do not take part; a statistically significant difference.
- **3** Our workshops are **proven to increase student confidence** in studying independently, revising, and attaining higher grades.
- 4 Our workshops have a **positive impact on socio-economic factors**, particularly surrounding student motivation and aspirations for the future.

This independent analysis forms the backbone of this impact brief, and it was the catalyst for us to write it. The key findings above show that the skills taught in our workshops are a 'need' for students. Compiling this impact brief has made us incredibly proud. We hope you enjoy reading it.

We took proven and innovative thinking skills, coupled with advances in neuroscience and designed workshops in which students would learn how to think in an explicit and concrete manner – allowing them to access the curriculum, consolidate their learning and ultimately achieve better results.

How do we do it?

To achieve our objectives, our work focuses on sharing the cognitive and meta-cognitive thinking skills which allow students to:

- Manage their time
- Increase motivation
- Clarify aspirations and ambition
- Become responsible and organised
- Build respect for oneself and for others
- Become active readers, listeners and learners
- Identify strengths and weaknesses and pinpoint areas for development

These skills enable students to enhance their self-esteem and self-efficacy, ultimately leading to higher levels of attainment and progression, **allowing our young people to build brighter futures.**

Workshop Trends

Over the last 13 years, as the challenges to schools have transformed, we in turn have experienced shifts in workshop choice and logistics. We have noticed:

- **One-hour workshops** have become far more popular than two-hour workshops. Before COVID, one-hour workshops accounted for less than 20% of our delivery, **now they account for more than 75%.**
- Fewer workshops focused on motivation are being requested. Instead, we are experiencing a rise in demand for 'Positive Mindset'; focused on managing anxiety and overcoming self-doubt.
- Our workshops centred on revision (Exams MADE Easy and Rapid Revision) were previously the preserve of year 11. Now, many schools are requesting these workshops for their year 10 cohorts.
- Since the pandemic, we have noticed that we are working with smaller groups; around 30 students compared to a previous average of around 80.

Who Evaluated us?

Foreword

Alongside working with individual clients, we at MADE are proud to have been chosen to work with funded projects from the Office for Students (OFS). Having the opportunity to contribute to these projects has afforded us the ability to access data produced from independent feedback reports. These reports are particularly fascinating to us, as they provide impartial data on a deep level, spanning through many years of the students' educational journey. The data we have used in the case studies featured on the following pages, comes from the three separate outreach projects described below.

MAKE

HAPPEN

Make Happen Essex:

Make Happen works with teachers and advisors to unlock opportunities for young people across Essex, by helping them make informed choices about their education and future. They chose MADE Training as a core facilitation partner in 2017, and since then we have delivered over 100 outreach events on behalf of Make Happen. Make Happen have tracked the success of their students who participated in MADE Training workshops via the Higher Education Access Tracker (HEAT).

In 2021, Make Happen collated the results of linking data from Make Happen outreach participants with UCAS applicant and accepted-applicant data through the UCAS STROBE service. This was in order to determine the numbers of specific outreach participants who had afterwards a) applied to Higher Education; and b) been accepted into Higher Education. Specifically students who had worked only with Make Happen's delivery partners MADE Training were isolated in order to determine the association between receiving outreach from this provider and consecutive application and acceptance into Higher Education (HE) via UCAS. They were compared to a matched control group (both groups N=232).



Next Steps South West:

Next Steps South West (NSSW) provides impartial information and signposting so that students can make an informed decision about their future. From 2018-2020, MADE Training worked with over 9000 students within 35 schools and colleges across the counties of Dorset, Devon, Somerset and Cornwall. The workshops delivered, aimed to support students with the development of their study and revision skills. By providing students with an opportunity to enhance these skills, it was anticipated the sessions would motivate students and raise their aspirations to progress to HE. These aims aligned with the lack of Soft Skills which was a key barrier, identified by NSSW, that prevents young people to progress to HE. All events were evaluated by MADE Training and independently by NSSW. In three quantitative questions, included in these surveys, students were asked to evaluate their progress by rating their level of agreement with pre and post-activity statements.

GREATER MANCHESTER HIGHER

Greater Manchester Higher:

Greater Manchester Higher (GMH) aims to improve the provision of information, advice and guidance about progression routes to higher education (HE), alongside offering a menu of activities to raise the aspirations of young people in Greater Manchester. GMH have worked with MADE Training for over 5 years, delivering workshops in schools and colleges across the greater Manchester area. In 2019, GMH commissioned Cosmos, an independent insights group to evaluate the impact of MADE Training's workshops on the young people that they worked with. Over 1200 students were surveyed using a detailed pre and post evaluation process.



Case Study Inspire How we INSPIRE young people to RAISE ASPIRATIONS

We understand that aspirations are personal and as unique to each student as their fingerprint. What MADE seeks to do is to inspire and motivate each student we work with, to want to realise their aspirations and unlock their full potential.

Our workshops which focus on motivation and resilience are carefully designed to deliver a strong foundation of thinking skills to clarify aspirations, ignite inspiration and increase self-belief upon which the blocks of attainment and progression can be built.

The first step on any journey is believing the end destination is achievable and within your reach. Our workshops help students to set goals, create plans to achieve them and develop the courage and confidence to take action, raise attainment and make progress.

Greater Manchester Higher reported that **71% of their students**, after attending MADE workshops, **felt more confident about what they might do in future.**

Higher Horizons asked their students who had attended our workshops how they had impacted them. On average 61.8% of students either agreed or strongly agreed that attending our MADE Training workshops had made them think about applying to Higher Education or university in the future.

Next Steps South West (NSSW) found that after attending MADE workshops **80% of their students agreed they were better able to make decisions about their future, and 83% felt more able to set goals.** This was furthermore supported by 86% of their teaching staff agreeing that the majority of students had learned something about Higher Education or career planning and that the sessions had raised students' aspirations, indicating impact on the barrier of Socio-economic factors. All of the teaching staff agreed that they want to arrange for MADE Training to deliver workshops in their schools again.

Case Study Equip How we EQUIP young people with the skills to RAISE ATTAINMENT

Once the foundations of inspiration and motivation have been laid, the next step is to build upon them and equip students with the tools they need to be able to learn and revise effectively, achieve the grades they want and to move closer to achieving their aspirations.

Our workshops which focus on study and revision skills are designed and delivered in a way that make the skills transferable, memorable and tangible. Practical exercises are used to demonstrate to the students the impact and possibilities that the skills provide. We are proud of how students engage in our workshops, the levels of enthusiasm and engagement are often so high, the air in the room feels as if it is charged with electricity. With a keen focus on improving thinking skills and approaches to learning, MADE's study and revision skills workshops have been purposely created to suit a range of different study requirements and abilities; from supporting students transitioning into Key Stage 3 to students revising for their GCSE, A-level, university exams and beyond. We also support all stakeholders involved in raising student attainment through our Parents' Evening and Staff CPD workshop sessions, delivering practical advice on how best to support students with their revision, implement new learning strategies and encourage independent study.

NSSW reported that 87% of students felt more confident in studying independently after attending their study skills focused workshop, with 88% agreeing that they knew more about how to revise effectively for exams, and 80% stating that they felt better able to study on their own.

Greater Manchester Higher found that after MADE Training workshops that 87% of their students now knew how to revise effectively for their exams and 79% now felt confident in their ability to study independently and revise for their exams.

Make Happens HEAT report recorded that the (MADE Training) treatment group had a Higher Education Acceptance Rate (HEAR) nine percentage points higher than the matched control group. A statistically significant difference of 93% versus 84%.

Case Study Sustain How we SUSTAIN the impact to empower young people to PROGRESS

Our support and involvement with the students we meet doesn't end with our workshops. We provide unique and meticulously designed resources for each of our workshops, which the students complete and keep. This allows them to refer back to the powerful new skills they have discovered and mastered with MADE Training. We also offer our Thinking Skills Platform as a continual resource to students. We can offer bespoke learning platforms to education organisations, which allow their staff and students to access our brilliant online learning courses. These can be used by the students as an independent task or incorporated into tutor group activities, providing consistent support to every student, throughout the academic year.

MADE understand the long-term benefits that our ongoing support can have on a student's attainment and progression. We are proud of the lasting relationships we have built up since 2010, allowing us to re-visit and support cohorts as they have progressed through their academic careers. Having the opportunity to not only witness but also participate in and contribute to their successes is a real honour and privilege.

Make Happens HEAT report found that a treatment group who took part in MADE Training outreach activities had a **Higher Education application rate** 22 percentage points higher than a matched control group not taking part, (63% versus 41%), a statistically significant difference. The treatment group also accepted their offers in higher proportion than the matched control group (96% versus 89%).

Thinking Skills Platform

Blended learning emerged as one of the leading pedagogical concepts at the beginning of the 21st century and with advancement in smart technology, has flourished since. The need for online learning became ever more present during the COVID-19 pandemic, leading to the adoption of digital learning as a key component of mainstream education.

We first developed an online portal in response to an overwhelming number of requests for MADE Training to provide on-going support to the schools and students we work with. Many of our client organisations saw the direct impact our thinking skills had on their students and wanted this to reach their wider student body. The demand for online support to students increased greatly when lockdown hit schools and colleges. This gave us the time and determination to create our online portal which developed into the Thinking Skills Platform we proudly offer today.

Our Thinking Skills Platform (TSP) has reached more than 50,000 students

so far- providing our client organisations and their students with independent study skills courses that can be completed at their own pace and convenience. Our TSP is also structured to allow the opportunity for each of the courses to be used in-class, by form tutors as a group learning activity where reflections, key skills and ideas can be shared and discussed.

We are proud that our TSP provides an holistic blended learning approach. Our platform is comprised of video episodes and guided workbooks to help explain and embed each of the skills. At the end of each course there are assessment opportunities which allow the students to complete their own knowledge check and self-assessment. This function generates data, which allows staff to track student progression and identify which courses or strategies the students may require additional support with.


Each course of episodes has its own pre and post evaluation surveys. These gives an insight into the change and progression of the students' mindset as they make their journey through the platform's curriculum.

As with all aspects of education, the quality of what is put into the learning materials and delivery of online and blended learning will have a huge impact on, and ultimately determine what the students get out of it. We have combined our many years of experience, expertise in study skills and real passion for education to build a learner management system (LMS) that provides and delivers first class support.

We are extremely proud of our Thinking Skills Platform and the feedback we have received about how it provides huge benefit to the students who have access. Complementing and reinforcing the skills taught and encouraged in our Live and Virtual MADE Training workshops, we are thrilled to provide the option of this service to continue supporting students throughout their academic career.

- Ensured that 100% of our disposable printed resources is made from fully recycled paper. We are committed to having all our paper resources to be printed on recycled stock by the end of 2023.


Charitable initiaives

No matter how big or small, we believe you should always help others. That's why we have supported the following two initiatives:

Magic Breakfast – To succeed at school, students not only need the necessary thinking skills, but also the energy to apply them. We partner with Magic Breakfast to help this happen. Magic Breakfast ensures that no child in their partner schools is too hungry to learn by providing healthy breakfast food and expert support to help identify and reach those pupils at risk of hunger. A hungry child cannot concentrate so could miss out on half a day of lessons every school day if not given anything nutritious to eat first thing. For every workshop day booked with MADE Training, we will provide 25 breakfasts across the nation.



Myeloma UK – We have worked collaboratively with racing driver Jonny Williams in the development of one of our workshops using his expertise with the technique known as 'the aggregation of marginal gains'. We worked together, introducing this powerful skill to students in our Marginal Gains workshop. Sadly, during 2012, Jonny was diagnosed with Myeloma (a blood cancer arising from plasma cells). As part of his ongoing treatment, Jonny has taken part in three clinical trials to contribute in the search to find the best treatment options for other patients. After successful treatment provided by Myeloma UK and moving into remission, Jonny returned to racing in 2021 and wanted to raise awareness for the charity that has helped him so much. MADE provided support for Jonny during his 'Race for Myeloma', helping to raise over £1500 for this amazing charity.
